How do I revise?

To fully prepare for all three papers, you want to complete as many past and practice papers as you can. This will be in addition to the Practice papers that you will be getting from your teachers.

When you get stuck on a question, identify which topic it is that so that you can then use the videos on either CorbettMaths or MathsGenie to help you. Should you need further support, please don't hesitate to contact your teachers or the Maths Department for help.

In the two weeks leading up to Paper 1, focus solely on the topics that do not require a calculator. These will be topics where you will be able to complete the calculations either mentally or by written methods (multiplication, division, etc.). You will be provided with plenty of practice papers in the lead up to this paper by the department but do complete the ones available using the links below.

For Papers 2 and 3, make sure that you know how to use your calculator and convert between fraction and decimal answers. Make sure that you know how to use your trigonometry buttons (sin, cos, tan, \sin^{-1} , \cos^{-1} , \tan^{-1}). Make sure that you know how to use your "ANS" button and use the fraction button.
