Students who choose Music have 5 hours curriculum time every 2 weeks.

To support the delivery of the curriculum we have 2 specialist music classrooms that include keyboards and MacBook technology, 3 specialist practice or peri rooms, a MacBook suite and a variety of specialist equipment to support a wider offer of in class experiences and specialist music tuition.

All students in Years 10 to 13 are 1:1 iPad user and therefore have access to additional technology.

Part B: Co-curricular music

Outside of the formal curriculum we offer peripatetic lessons. These are on offer in

- Drums
- Guitar (Electric and Acoustic)
- Bass Guitar
- Piano
- Vocals

We signpost students who have interest in Woodwind and Brass instruments to local teachers.

Peripatetic lessons are funded for Pupil Premium and Key Stage 4 Music Tech and Music GCSE students

There are Music clubs running every lunchtime, including: Music Club (KS4); Music Tech Club (All Years); Music Club (All Years); Music Theory (All Years).

We have three separate practice room spaces to support students in peripatetic lessons, with small group or individual work or performance.

Part C: Musical experiences / Music visits

Recent examples include:

- New sounds Project – Britton Sinfonia (Year 10, 11, 12)
- Trips to concerts (variety of year groups), for example, The Earth Reborn from Darkness Concert
- Birmingham Symphony Orchestra (Year 10)
- Participation in school musicals and productions (variety of year groups)
- In school summer and winter concerts (variety of year groups)
- Performing at school events, for example, Awards Evening (variety of year groups)
- Participation in our Diversity Day (Variety of year groups)
