were completed including the installation of flood lighting to the hard play/sport area. We have also worked in partnership with the City Council to purchase the equipment for the new fitness suite in the re-furbished swimming pool. Special Lunch for Jack Hunt's Sporting Stars

Jack Hunt School is proud of its many sporting stars, and recently some of the students were invited to a special lunch with Mr Duncan to congratulate them and talk about their impressive achievements during the summer.

In Rowing, Year 13 student James Fox has been the Under 18 Great Britain National Champion three times and finished 6th Best at Henley. He is also currently the European Under 18 Champion, winning a Gold Medal at the European Championships in France. Other rowing successes have been achieved by Year 12 students Tom Chung and Sam Tuck.

Tom won Silver and Bronze Medals at the Under 18 Great Britain Junior European Championships in France and reached Henley as a semi-finalist, while Sam another Great Britain Rower, also qualified for Henley and received the Under 16 Gold Medal at the European Championships and achieved a Silver Medal at the National Championships.

colleges across Peterborough came together to witness the emergency services in action. 'The Accident' scenario organised by 'The Britten Partnership' and sponsored by Aimhigher, Health Skills East and NHS East England provided an opportunity for students to observe the collaboration, skills, equipment and professionalism of the fire, ambulance and police services when dealing with a car



Peterborough Regional College provided Drama students who played the roles of the casualties and their Media and Makeup Department students provided very realistic looking injuries, which in turn contributed overall to a very convincing accident scene.

Students were then able to take part in workshops facilitated by staff from Health, Care, and Youth Offending Teams alongside the Police, Fire and Ambulance Services to discuss the ongoing care needs of the victims and the consequences of reckless driving.

The Society Health & Development Diploma Day was an outstanding success and feedback from students was extremely positive. The day was the first of what will be a series of work related experiences that students can access. It heralds a new and exciting learning experience which brings teaching alive and makes it more relevant.
